

## IELTS on Computer

- IELTS on Computer is aimed at people who want to study in an English-speaking environment, work in or emigrate to an English-speaking country, or get a job in your own country where English proficiency is required. For this reason, there are two IELTS tests to choose from – Academic and General Training.
- Before booking your test, we advise you to check with the organisation requesting that you take an IELTS test as to which version they will accept.

## Applications

- All applications must be made in advance.
- Please apply via our website <https://www.folkuniversitetet.se/mer-om-sprak/sprakexamina-och-sprakprov/ielts-test/ielts-goteborg/>
- You must provide a copy of your ID document during the application process. You can either upload it or send it to us by email or post. You must have the original document with you on test day.
- The only accepted ID is your passport OR, if you are an EU national, your national ID card. The only accepted Swedish national ID card is the one issued by Polismyndigheten (Swedish police). Skatteverket ID and driving licences are not accepted.

## Speaking Test

- The Speaking test takes around 15-20 minutes and is usually scheduled on the same day as the three written components (Listening, Reading and Writing).
- If you do attend your speaking test at the scheduled time, there is a fee of 500 SEK including VAT.

## Practice Materials

- A link to practice material is available to you from the British Council once your registration is complete. There is also a self-study book ‘Official IELTS Practice Materials’ available to order from online bookshops.

## Test Results

- IELTS on Computer test results will be available in your IELTS Test Taker Portal between 1 and 5 calendar days after the test. The result is downloadable as a pdf document for sharing with institutions, organisations and schools. Very rarely, results can be delayed in which case you will receive an email informing you of the delay.
- If an organisation will not accept your result directly from you and instead requires that we, as your test centre, share your result directly with them, please request this through your IELTS Test Taker Portal. Most institutions have signed up to receive results electronically but some require that we send results to them by post. We may charge a fee to cover the postal cost if you request that we share your result with more than five institutions by post.
- British Council rules forbid us from emailing results and giving results over the phone.

## Not Happy With Your Results? You have three options.

- Book a new test.
- Enquiry on Result (EOR): If you are not satisfied with all or part of your result, you may request an enquiry on result (EOR) through your IELTS Test Taker Portal. The EOR payment will be refunded if your result increases after being re-marked. Your result will normally be available within 21 days. All EOR applications and payments must be received no later than 6 weeks after your test date.
- One Skill Retake: Retake just one part of the test. You can read more [here](#).
