#### FIRST PILOT TEST IN TENERIFE

On January 15, 2025, the first pilot project of the Autism Friendly Training project was held in the city of Tenerife, within the framework of the Erasmus+ Program. The event consisted of a training day on autism and its application in the hotel sector, aimed at industry professionals, with the aim of raising awareness and training participants in caring for people with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD).

The activity took place at the Paradise Park Fun Lifestyle Hotel and was attended by 53 hotel industry professionals, including waiters, managers, receptionists, chefs, and administrative staff, all interested in improving their understanding and treatment of people with ASD.

#### Key points covered:

- Definition and characteristics of Autism Spectrum Disorder.
- Effective communication strategies with people with ASD.
- Adaptions to services and the environment to promote greater inclusion.
- Case studies and real-life examples of care in the hotel sector.
